About this form

This form is only to be used by veterinarians and authorised identifiers to identify microchip numbers when implanting them, as required under the *Companion Animals Act 1998*. You must give the completed form to council within 3 days of identification.

Alternatively, vets and authorised identifiers can log in to the NSW Pet Registry Vet/AI portal to enter microchip numbers directly into the registry within 48 hours of identification.

Pet owners must be over 18 years of age to legally own a cat or dog in NSW.

This form does not register a pet — give council a completed Pet Registration (R2) form and pay the fee to officially register your pet.

Please fill out this form in black ink and in BLOCK LETTERS.

Print out as many copies of this form as required to permanently identify animals in a litter.

Breeders, owners, veterinarians and authorised identifiers should all keep a copy of this form for their own records.

Information for permanently identifying a litter

Veterinarians and authorised identifiers must complete this form and submit it to council when microchipping animals in a breeder's litter. Anyone whose pet has had a litter of puppies or kittens is considered a breeder in NSW.

If you are microchipping a litter, please ensure the mother's microchipping number is included in this form.

Information for permanently identify an individual animal (including strays)

Veterinarians and authorised identifiers can use this form when microchipping a single animal outside a litter, or when microchipping strays. You do not need to add the litter mother's microchip number or BIN.

What to do next if you are selling or giving away a pet

Get a copy of the Change of owner (C3A) form online at <u>petregistry.olg.nsw.gov.au</u> or from your local council. You and the new owner must complete and sign the form.

You are responsible for sending the completed C3A form to any local council within 14 days.

Privacy information

Only authorised people can access the information provided on this form, and only to enforce the *Companion Animals Act* 1998.

If you are concerned that disclosure of your information could jeopardise the safety of you or your family, you may request that these details be suppressed. Please contact any NSW local council for more information.
